The Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health (IECMH) Therapist provides home and clinic based infant and early childhood and perinatal mental health services to North King County and South Snohomish County families. There are multiple positions for this role and will be a non-exempt position based out of our Lynnwood location. The therapist will report to the IECMH Manager.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES – Specific for this position

- Provide infant and early childhood mental health services to families with children ages birth to six and pregnant people in their home or in a clinic setting, using relationship-based approaches
- Provide diagnostic assessments sing the DC 0-5 manual
- Collaborate with the CHS WISe Program and engage in WISe teams with IEC age clients enrolled in WISe



- Participate in program development and evaluation of the IEC Program and overall Community-based Intensive Services (CBIS) Department
- Actively promote CHS programs to families and individuals; develop and maintain relationships with community contacts, referral sources, and other professionals and agencies
- Maintain accurate and thorough clinical records as per agency, county and state requirements
- Provide input and report to leadership regarding the clinical needs of clients and improved ways of offering services and supervision.
